It was of absolute extreme importance to drive through the "Big Boys" parking lot a few times (you could casually mention it a few times at school on Monday) before going over to the "White Castle to share a bag of 10 for a dollar hamburgers. If you were really flush (babysitting got me a whopping 50 cents an hour because I'd do housework after the kids went to bed) you also got sodas or *talk about heaven*, Black Cows (Root Beer floats to all you Arizona folks).

The police were not friendly to these cars full of kids. We would be stopped for going under the speed limit (you had to be able to see just which girl was in that car with the football star player), or having a tail light out (what was more important here – cruising to be an “in” person or fixing the car??) and cars that were packed solid with kids were guaranteed to be pulled over, followed by calls to parents for kid pick-up.

Well, things in Detroit have really changed (*as more and more of us pass the 50 mark, we are taking over the world*). The annual “Woodward Dream Cruise” (started in 1995 by Nelson House as a way to raise funds for a children’s soccer field) has become one of the largest car events in the USA. On the third Saturday in August, a 16 mile long strip of Woodward Avenue that stretches through 9 Detroit cities, becomes host to thousands of old and unique cars. There are so many vehicles, they actually fill 4 of the 5 lanes going in both the North and South directions (one lane in each way is blocked off for emergency vehicles). All the business parking lots, restaurant parking lots, and public parking lots on both sides of the road are filled with people who come with folding chairs and coolers, to sit and watch, and often cheer, the cars as they go by.

You can see every kind of car ever made in Detroit (and just a very few made outside of Detroit), plus restored school buses, old police vehicles, every imaginable hot rod, cars covered in pop top clips, feathers, and painted in zebra stripes, antique motorcycles, and cars rebuilt to look like forest cabins. You’ll not only see pristine cars from the 1920’s through 1980’s (most restored – but many only restored to the point of being able to run), but also concept cars, cars driven by people in gorilla costumes, a car with an out-house built on top. We took hundreds of pictures.

Part of the time, Reg cruised in his brother Walt’s 1966, 442, Oldsmobile Post. This car came from Arizona to Michigan in 1984. He has fully restored it and painted it with a 1960’s Lincoln color, Metallic Medium Charcoal Grey (very classy looking). Another of Reg’s brothers, Don, cruised with family and friends in his restored Target Red, Blacktop 1966, GT1 390, Ford Fairlane Convertible. The rest of the time we were spectators too.

Even though the “Official” day of the cruise is on Saturday, people start arriving and driving up and down Woodward Avenue by Thursday evening, and continue through Sunday afternoon. The numbers for the 2006 cruise haven’t yet been tabulated, but in 2005 there were 1.7 million people there and over 40,000 classic cars to see.

### **MESQUITE GRILLED SALMON**

8-10 oz. filet, seasoned and mesquite-grilled, on a bed of Chimichirri sauce. Served with rice and sautéed vegetables.

### **HALIBUT**
